
Derby Cycle Map

Features

This map is designed so that you can plan your route according to your own ability.

- We have attempted to show all roads and paths legally available for cyclists to use.
- Bridleways and minor roads are shown regardless of their condition and suitability for cycling. In general private roads are not shown.
- In a few cases we have shown routes as bridleways when they are legally open to motor vehicles, but are rarely used by motorists.
- National and local cycle route numbers are shown.

Besides these attractions there are many other things for cyclists to do. Follow the advised routes out of the city and head for the countryside. Explore the lanes, visit archaeological sites, discover new places and generally enjoy being away from the traffic. A breath of fresh air!

Advanced stop lines

- Advanced stop lines enable cyclists to negotiate junctions safely.
- When the traffic signals are red, cyclists move ahead to a 'reservoir' area to position themselves safely ahead of motorists.
